



Meridian Waste and the City of Winfield Collected 68 Tons of Flood Debris in Community Cleanup Day

Company Provided Free Roll-off Containers and Disposal

ST. LOUIS, Mo. (July 1, 2019) – [Meridian Waste](#), an integrated, non-hazardous solid waste services company, partnered with the City of Winfield and other event organizers for a community-wide cleanup yesterday and collected more than 68 tons of flood debris. More than 160 volunteers collected debris from homes and businesses throughout the City, and as a result, more than 137,000 pounds were properly disposed.

Area residents and church volunteers, after a Sunday morning onsite blessing and service, helped clean up the City and their homes and dispose of all flood-related debris for free in Meridian Waste provided roll-off containers located within the City. Meridian Waste also waived all disposal fees at its Winfield Transfer Station to help residents during this community-wide cleanup event.
