

Meridian Waste and Wright City Officials Announce Dual-Stream Recycling Program Success

Congratulating Residents on 100 Percent Clean Rate

WRIGHT CITY, Mo. (July 10, 2019) – Meridian Waste, an integrated, non-hazardous solid waste services company, along with Wright City officials today announced the successful launch of dual-stream recycling collection program, which rolled out in May.

Residents have followed the new guidelines for the rigids and fiber only carts extremely well resulting in a 100 percent clean rate, and not one load from the 21 tons of recyclables collected since May has been rejected at the material recycling facility (MRF) due to contamination.

"We want to applaud Wright City residents for making a smooth transition to dual stream and being careful to only put in the correct recyclable items in their two carts," said Michelle Vohsen, operations manager for Meridian Waste. "Converting to dual-stream recycling helps to ensure cleaner, less contaminated recyclables while broadening the marketplace willing to accept and market the materials for reuse and true recycling."

When a load contains incorrect items, it is deemed contaminated, rejected at the MRF, and then sent to be disposed of in the landfill. A green tag grading system was implemented to educate residents and help keep the stream clean, which is vital to the success of the program.

"We all want to do what is right for our community and for our environment. Unfortunately, it's not always that simple. Wright City residents have gone above and beyond to do the right thing and to continue recycling, even when it hasn't been easy," said Wright City Mayor Dan Rowden. "Since our switch to dual-stream recycling, Wright City residents continuously produce some of the cleanest and least-contaminated recycling in the area. The City continues to look for ways to improve the recycling process and make recycling responsibly easy and convenient. The Board of Aldermen and I want to thank our residents for their support and continued efforts to make recycling a huge success in Wright City!"
