With a dedication to Green Building, Meridian Waste helps conserve more natural resources and landfill space by recycling economically-viable construction and demolition debris. Recycling materials include treated/untreated wood, shingles, sheetrock, brick, concrete, dirt, asphalt, metal, aluminum, copper, cardboard, paper, carpet, carpet padding, and clean plastic.

In October, the Shotwell C&D Landfill plans to host its second Charity Pumpkin Patch with all proceeds from the sale of pumpkins being donated back to the community.
