All acquired rolling stock have been transferred to Meridian Waste's Bowling Green hauling operation located at 3100 Highway VV, Bowling Green, Missouri 63334, where the assets will be integrated into existing residential, commercial and industrial collection operations. The consolidation will improve route density, optimize fleet utilization and position the company for continued strategic growth throughout northeast Missouri.
